## Enrollment Growth at Two-Year Colleges Pushes State Total to New High

HARTFORD, Nov.20 – **Enrollment at Connecticut colleges and universities this fall grew by 3.6 percent from last fall to 191,227 for a new record high and the largest annual gain in two decades**, according to preliminary figures released today by the Connecticut Department of Higher Education. Growth at the state’s 12 community colleges and five two-year private institutions accounted for 65.4 percent of the annual gain.

The new total breaks previous records for the eighth straight year and continues a steady climb begun in 1997. At the two-year colleges, enrollment shot up by 8.2 percent, four times greater than the more modest increase of 1.8 percent at the four-year colleges and universities.

“As with everything else, the economy is having a tremendous impact on higher education,” stated Michael P. Meotti, commissioner of higher education. “The harder it becomes to find a job, the more people opt to enroll in college for retraining or a degree. Many are taking advantage of lower cost two-year colleges while students at four-year colleges appear to be staying there until they get their degrees. Connecticut’s higher education institutions have done a great job in responding to greater demand, despite their tighter resources.

“We expect this growth to subside in the future, however, since this year represents the tail end of a peak in traditional college-age students,” Meotti noted. “Demographics show a shrinking pool of high school graduates whose racial and ethnic backgrounds will be more diverse than ever before, re-shaping the make-up of our future college graduates and workforce.”

Across the state, part-time enrollment climbed 4.9 percent, and full-time enrollment rose a healthy 3.0 percent. Undergraduate totals were up 3.9 percent to 155,284, and graduate student counts increased 2.4 percent to 35,943.

Fall enrollment at state-supported colleges and universities grew by 4,753 students or 4.1 percent to 121,132, making up 71.1 percent of the state’s overall increase. New records were set at the University of Connecticut, Eastern and Western Connecticut State Universities, and nine of the 12 community colleges. Within the independent sector, overall counts rose by 2.9 percent to 69,121 students, accounting for 28.8 percent of the statewide total. Yale University, six regionals and two two-year colleges reached new highs, the latter due to more students pursuing nursing careers. The federally-supported U. S. Coast Guard constitutes the remaining 0.1 percent of the statewide total.
